Message from Pastor Sean

I have been thinking about the various activities that we have begun again after a two year pause due to COVID. I thought about the ones that have already occurred and the events that are coming up. All of these activities are centered on one thing; it is for WELC to spread God's love not just to our members but also to the community. It is especially important to share the good news of Jesus Christ to those who have never heard the good news, or to those who have been hurt by the church in the past.

As I was thinking about this, one of our recent bible passages came to mind – from Luke 10:1-20. In this passage Jesus is sending out his disciples ahead of him in pairs. Jesus gives them authority to perform many deeds of power and he tells the disciples to bring peace, but if they are not accepted to wipe the dust from their sandals and move on. At the end of the passage the disciples return joyful because all of what they were able to accomplish they said "Lord, in your name, even the demons submit to us." (Luke 10:17) But then Jesus goes on to say, "Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

We feel good when our activities and events fulfill our expectations. We feel good when we can bring the good news to those who have not heard the good news. But what I take away from Jesus' words at the end of the passage is, it is not about how good we feel when we accomplish our goals, but it is through our work that God sees our good works. That we are to rejoice that in following God's path, we are doing God's will and God rejoices in that and we are to rejoice too.

So as we get ready for our activities and events, some that we have done before and some that will be brand new for our church, may we remember that by working together, by sharing the love of God, and by rejoicing in the work itself we can rejoice that God's sees and our reward will be in heaven.
